It's been a very busy few months and we're not slowing down yet. Classes have been visiting the New York State Museum every Wednesday and Friday for Early Bird Programs. Trumaster, one of the NYS museum educators, brought in the "feathers & fur" program. He'll be back in May & June. Carol Ann Margolis from the Albany Visitors Center continued working with the 3rd grade on the Heritage Garden Program and the history of different plants. Professor Hopkins from St. Rose came in and discussed the science of seeds and we planted several different kinds. Both of them will be back for Programs in May & June. The museum grow table is up and running. We are growing the Three Sisters (corn, bean and squash). We have several herbs growing (basil, parsley and chive) and several different kinds flowers (zinnia, echinacea and petunias). It's almost time to plant them outdoors.
